Entire site must contain at least five links and five images/pictures which are related to the chosen theme. Font and colors should be consistent throughout the site.
- Juniors should include 1-2 pages.
- Intermediates should include 3-5 pages
- Seniors should include 5-15 pages.

DEPARTMENT 111 CLOVER CLIMBERS

- This program is for five to eight year olds, as of January 1 of the current year, who MUST belong to a Gratiot County 4-H Club. A 4-H Leader's name must be indicated on the GCFFY entry form.
- 8 year olds choosing to show as a regular fair exhibitor may not show in Clover Climber classes.
- Register using the Fair Entry Form which is due June 15.
- Clover Climbers will be divided into Junior Clover Climbers (five to six year olds) and Senior Clover Climbers (seven to eight year olds).
- Still exhibit items are judged at the Clover Climber area on Sunday. Youth will discuss their projects with a judge. Projects will be displayed with their club display for the week of the fair and will be released with all other exhibits.
- All exhibits in the Foods class MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A RECIPE CARD INCLUDING RECIPE AND PICTURE that will be put on display instead of the food. Recipe cards need to be picked up prior to fair at the MSU Extension Office.
- Every exhibit should include an entry tag (with the exception of livestock animals), available at the MSU Extension Office.
- ALL Clover Climbers MUST follow the Michigan 4-H Cloverbud Program Policies.
- All entries must be the work of the member, excluding livestock that may be borrowed from other exhibitors.
- There will be a Clover Climber parade at 3:00 p.m. in the Large Arena and an ice cream social in the Pioneer Pavilion following the parade Thursday of fair week.
- The Clover Climber parade will consist of one still exhibit for Junior Clover Climbers,

and one still exhibit or one animal for Senior Clover Climbers (if exhibitor is using an animal, they must have an adult or 4-H'er with them).

- Premiums will not be awarded.
- Clover Climbers will only be allowed in classes with other Clover Climbers.
- Clover Climber showmanship classes will exhibit first.
- Absolutely NO SALES in the auctions.

JUNIOR CLOVER CLIMBERS

- Five to six year old Clover Climbers are eligible to exhibit one to three still exhibits.

SENIOR CLOVER CLIMBERS

- Seven and eight year old Clover Climbers are eligible to exhibit four items (either one animal and three still exhibits or four still exhibits).
- Livestock Restrictions -
 - Dairy calf under six months
 - Beef calf under six months
 - Sheep market weight
 - Swine market weight
- Animal must be the size Clover Climber can handle.
- Clover Climbers will show prior to showmanship events.
- Clover Climbers choosing to exhibit a livestock animal must house their animals in the proper livestock building.
